## EU Settlement Scheme



Brent is one of the Local Authorities providing **identity document scanning** for those applying to the EU Settlement Scheme.

**You must not start your application before you attend your appointment.**

This service is available to resident EU citizens with a valid EU passport, and to their non-EU citizen family members with a biometric residence card issued by the UK.

If you do not have access to an **Android device with near field communication (NFC)**, you can make an appointment to bring your passport or biometric residence card to Brent Council, **Brent Civic Centre, Engineers Way, Wembley HA9 0FJ**, where it can be scanned and verified for you.
