Children must be able to write in a variety of genres.

- Narrative (stories)
- Information Texts- reports
- Recount Texts, including newspapers/magazines
- Explanations
- Persuasion

- Poetry- narrative poems, raps, language

Please provide opportunities for your child to access a variety of texts. For example, newspapers, leaflets, brochures, recipes, letters...

Maths

By the end of key stage 2, children must be able to:

- understand the number system and place value to include larger numbers up to 10 million. (comparing, rounding, ordering)
- carry out written calculation methods (column)
- understand and apply fraction, decimals, and percentages (linked to multiplication and division)
- solve a wider range of problems, including increasingly complex calculations and using algebra.
- solve problems in other areas of maths including geometry, measures and statistics.
- explain and justify using the correct mathematical vocabulary.
